Treasurer's Report

• The treasurer reported \$26,795.92 in Checking and \$3,640.00 in Savings and ATM-\$3,640.00 for a total \$36,79892. The Building Fund Savings balance is \$16,767.19. A motion was made by Jeff Farran and seconded by Merlin Felt to approve the treasurer's report. The motion carried.

Vouchers paid since the last meeting totaled \$22,670.90. A detailed list was emailed to each Director. A motion was made by Dave Jaeger and seconded by Todd Greunke to approve the vouchers. The motion carried.

New Business

- 2025 Camping fees which was tabled from the October 2023 meeting, was brought back to the table and discussed. State parks have a nightly rate of \$20 and Madison County fair is \$125/week. Our current rate is \$150 per week. It was agreed to leave the rate the same for 2025.
- 2024-2025 Camper/Boat storage fees which was tabled from the October 2023 meeting, was brought back to the table and discussed. Our current rate is \$220 for storage from October to May 1 and \$275 for year-round storage. It was agreed to leave the rate the same.

- Julie Schultz was present and discussed the removal of three horses before the 3:00 pm Sunday deadline. A discussion was held regarding the adoption of a new rule regarding this type of action and the consequences for the exhibitor. A draft of the rule was presented to the board for approval. A motion was made by Jeff Farran and seconded by Andy Nelson to approve the adoption of the new rule. The motion carried.
- A discussion was held regarding light poles. Trever Hartman has talked with NPPD and we can possibly get used pose for \$.50/foot for wooden one and if they have galvanized poles available, they will let us know. Valmont may have imperfect poles that they cannot use. We have a contact with Valmont to visit with regarding the poles. We would need at least 36 foot tall plus 8 feet to be buried. We will continue to explore our options.
- Parade of Lights will be held on November 16. The parade will start at 6:30 PM. Anyone that can help, meet at the fair office at 5:30.
- The City of Wayne would like to use the Midway area again for the youth soccer program. A motion was made by Dave Jaeger and seconded by Rod Gilliland to allow the use of the field. The motion carried.
- Convention Registrations were made available and must be turned in at the December meeting.
- Soup super will be held at 6:30 PM on December 14 before our regular meeting. Brad Roberts will bring chili, Diane Roeber-oyster, Dave Jaeger-chicken noodle and Todd will bring meat and cheese. Everyone else is asked to bring a side dish or dessert.
- A review of the livestock committee meeting was held. There were not a lot of changes requested at the meeting. County levels shows will be following the State Fair rules and regulations this year.
- Tree removal was discussed. There are a couple of trees that are damaged and need attention. Frahm and Sons will be contacted to take care of the walnut tree by the old wash rack and Burayek's yard, also the ash tree by the little theater will be taken care of.
- Brent Sherman and Cindy Sherman were present and gave a follow-up on the clean up derby. They presented a check for the rental of the track. They had 101 cars and approximately 559 in attendance. They made the track the full length of the grandstand which worked out very well. They suggested that next year they keep the upper levels of classes and promote more for the lower-level classes and gear those to the younger drivers. Overall, they were pleased with the turnout. They volunteered to help at our derby any way they can. Dates have been set for 2024.
- The security light by the office was discussed. Will contact Kyle Spokane to see why it stays on all the time and get it fixed.
