Each exhibit will receive only one award and possibly a special award. Only five (5) awards per premium number/category will be awarded. All special awards are in addition to the standard fair premiums and are the decision of the judge. Space will be assigned by the department chairman.

**Youth Division:** Dept. L-K. Exhibitors ages as of Fair Day. 12 and Under are encouraged to participate in the "Youth" Division. All exhibitors in the youth division will also receive a participation ribbon for all other entries with no cash award.

**Junior Division** in foods and sewing Dept. H & K. Exhibitors that are 13 years of age but have not reached their 18th birthday by entry day of the current fair year are eligible.

All Premiums/Awards will be \$1.50 for blue ribbon and \$1.00 for red ribbon.

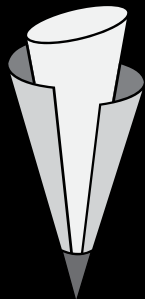
