EXHIBITS MUST BE ENTERED BY JULY 24 AT 12:00 NOON. Judging begins at 1:00 pm. Agricultural Hall will be closed to the public during judging.

Exhibitors may enter as many items in as many departments as they wish but **ONLY** one item per category.

All premium numbers are the same for all divisions.

Each exhibit will receive only one award and possibly a special award. Only five (5) awards per premium number/category will be awarded. All special awards are in addition to the standard fair premiums and are the decision of the judge.

Space will be assigned by the department chairman.

Youth Division: Dept. L-K. Exhibitors ages as of Fair Day. 12 and Under are encouraged to participate in the "Youth" Division. All exhibitors in the youth division will also receive a participation ribbon for all other entries with no cash award.

Junior Division in foods and sewing Dept. H & K. Exhibitors that are 13 years of age but have not reached their 18th birthday by entry day of the current fair year are eligible.

All Premiums/Awards will be \$1.50 for blue ribbon and \$1.00 for red ribbon.
